

New Jersey Health Foundation and Princeton University enter into agreement worth up to \$10 million



In October 2018, Princeton University (Princeton) and New Jersey Health Foundation (NJHF), a not-for-profit organization that supports health-related research and education, entered into an agreement that potentially provides \$10 million over the next five-years to support healthcare and drug discovery-related technology projects. Through this new collaborative framework, NJHF may contribute \$2 million a year to support Princeton's groundbreaking translational research and the start-up companies that hope to build upon that research for public use and benefit.
